Rapid, sprawling urbanization in southern California coastal sage scrub has created fragments of varying sizes within an urban matrix. As urban development and fragmentation continue, it is important for land managers to understand the impacts in order to devise and implement effective conservation plans. Fragmentation resulting in habitat loss and lack of connectivity is credited with altering basic ecological processes as well as population and community dynamics. Dana Morin shares with us her masters thesis on how fragmentation impacts carnivore activity and rodent communities.
